Left Residue of \$9,000 Estate

The Rev. Patrick J. Manton, pastor of St. Teresa's Roman Catholic Church, Blissville, is the chief beneficiary under the will of the late Bridget C. Cartman of 38-31 46th street, Sunnyside, which was filed yesterday in Jamaica Surrogate's Court.

Astoria Private Awarded Bronze Star For Capturing 20 Nazis on Reich Front

Capturing 20 Nazis and killing their squad leader on the German front has won the Bronze Star for Private First Class Irving Symonds of 31-24 35th street, Astoria.

In announcing Symonds, award today, the War Department also revealed that five other North Queens men have received the same medal. They are:

EDWARD GEBHARDT, T/Sgt. of 28-15 Steinway street, Astoria. ARTHUR P. CATALANI, 1st Lt. of 40-14 108th street, Corona. LOUIS R. SLATTERY, 1st Col. of 34-50 85th street, Jackson Heights. PHILIP D. DOULOS, 1st ser. of 42-34 70th street, Elmhurst. KEITH BONN, Etc., 37-13 149th place, Flushing.

While manning an outpost near the town of Stetten, Symonds observed 20 Nazis coming toward him. When the Germans ignored his order to surrender, Symonds opened fire, killing the leader. Immediately the other Nazis threw up their hands and allowed the Astorian to lead them away.

Symonds, 30-year-old infantryman, is still in the Reich Overseas 11 months, he served in France and Italy.

He worked for his father's stationery store in Astoria before entering the service 15 months ago. He trained in Alabama and Maryland. He came to Queens in 1938. Married to Mrs. Myrtle Symonds of the Astoria address, he has a 7-year-old daughter, Iva. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Symonds, former Astoria residents living in Pennsylvania.

Disarmed Mines

For successfully disarming anti-tank mines on the French front, Gebhardt, 23, was decorated. Now in Germany, he has been overseas a year.

An office worker before induction, December, 1942, he served in South Carolina and Tennessee until sent to Europe. A Queens resident for eight years, he is a graduate of Long Island City High School.

A brother, Raymond C. Louis Gebhardt, 20, is in the Pacific. Another brother, Robert, 27, was honorably discharged after four and a half years service as a corporal in Georgia.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Gebhardt, live at the Steinway street address.

Evacuated Company

Catalani, 25, received the medal for efficiency in evacuating an airborne medical company under unusually hazardous conditions in Germany, where he still serves with the 7th Army. Overseas 18 months, the medical administrative officer has been in France and Belgium.

He has two brothers in the Navy. Storekeeper 1/c Frederick, on an L.S.T. in the Pacific, and Storekeeper 2/c Nicholas, stationed in Boston awaiting duty on a destroyer.

Wounded in Germany

A church singer and member of the All-City Choral from Bayside High School before the war, 19-year-old Private Bonn also holds the Bronze Star with Oak Leaf cluster and the Combat Medical Badge of Valor.

He also has been awarded the Purple Heart Medal for shrapnel wounds of the arms and hands received at Heilbronn in Germany on April 12.

The former baritone soloist of Messiah Lutheran Church of Flushing served in the battles of Heilbronn, Bitch and Stuttgart. Overseas a year, he is now in Stuttgart.

"The medical corpsman won his first citation for meritorious achievement in the rescue of three wounded buddies on a hill under concentrated fire by the Nazis. He wrote home that he only accomplished it through 'the help of God and some P-47s and Spitfires' that plastered the enemy during the mission."

Won 2 More Medals

The details of how Bonn won the equivalent of a second Bronze Star, and then the Badge of Valor, are unknown to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Earle Bonn.

The fighting singer hasn't told them in his letters.

Bonn interrupted a musical career when he joined up July 5, 1943, not long after he had graduated from high school and at a time when he had already landed a spot in the Fred Waring Collegiate Choral.

He is a brother of the former unit at Michel Field.
