404 Joel Skidmore, sworn:

Direct examination by MR. DAILEY-

- Q. What is your business at present?
- A. Attached to the Supreme Court Circuit; I am a little over sixty and reside at Canarsie, Flatlands; in my early life I followed the bay and was familiar with Rockaway Beach and Inlet; I knew a place called "Old Gut" in my younger days; I have not been there lately; I have been up as far as the hills, I guess, shoving over it, you know; I think it is about fifty or seventy-five yards across the ocean; at that time I went up in small boats; I was engaged in shoving over, gunning, one thing and another; I know where Block House Point is.
 - Q. How about the growth of trees? Are there any trees? Are there any trees growing on the hills on each side?
- 406 A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. Is the growth of trees on each side different from what it is right in the bed of the "Old Gut?"
 - A. No, there ain't any there.
 - Q. What age are those trees on each side, should you jugde, or what size rather.
 - A. Well, I have not been there in a long time; I suppose it is eight or ten years since I have been there; my business calls me another way.

407 ALFRED H. Monroe, sworn.

Direct-examination by Mr. Dailey:

- Q. Where do you reside, Mr. Monroe?
- A. Jamaica; Jamaica South; I am a boatman; have been one almost all my days, ever since I was fourteen years old; I am sixty-five now; I am familiar with the location of what is called the "The Old Gut" or "Inlet;"
