## SOUTHWESTERN MONTANA AGAIN FEELS SHOCKS

HELENA, Mont.—Southwestern Montana again today was disturbed by earthquakes that were felt here, at Great Falls, Three Forks, Manhattan and Billings. No widespread damage was reported. The quake was most pronounced at Three Forks where it lasted for two minutes.

said he would take steps to prevent buses from running on Lockwood Avenue. Mayor Wiesendanger replied that Mr. Sullivan would not be a good citizen to stop other bus operations because the Central Avenue one had been stopped. He added he would use all his power as Mayor to insure the continuation of bus operations in the Tenth Ward.

Mr. Sullivan said he had been given official assurance from one member of the Public Service Commission that if the city officials granted a consent to a bus company to run on Central Avenue to the subway, the commission would grant that company a certificate of public convenience and necessity. He refused to explain his statement further.

myself conferred on an ordinance which was later passed by the Council, by the terms of which this city now regulates by ordinance the density of population. Therefore, we have taken care of this matter by ordinance, which is valid regardless of the question of home rule.

"When I say Yonkers is not seriously affected by this decision, I mean that no local law has been passed affecting salaries of employees by increase, and in fact no local law has been passed affecting the finances of the city. It appears that wherever danger is apparent, the situation has been taken care of by ordinance."

## Bus Tie Up Discussed By Central Taxpayers

The Central Taxpayers Association of the Ninth Ward decided last night to hold a special meeting next Wednesday night in School 4 to discuss a plan to tie up all bus operations in the city. This plan has been advocated by members of the association because of the sustaining of an injunction against Goldberg Brothers, restraining them from operating for the accommodation of members of the association on Central Avenue. The question of paralyzing all present bus operations has been referred to an advisory committee.

The association voted to instruct Alderman Stillwell to request Mayor Wiesendanger to prohibit trolley cars from being parked on Yonkers Avenue east of the race track in the afternoon.

The Association also discussed a report of the Aldermen's deliberations at City Hall yesterday afternoon, this report being made by President Thomas F. Sullivan.
