

BROOKLYN MAY WIN ANOTHER SENATOR IN REAPPORTIONMENT

Kings County Also Due to Gain
an Assemblyman, While Man-
hattan Is to Lose Four
Posts.

Brooklyn will gain one additional
seat in the State Senate and another
in the Assembly. It became known
to-day, if a new reapportionment
bill now being drawn is passed at
Albany and approved by Governor
Smith.

This was the definite data made
available to-day when Republican
County Leader J. A. Livingston con-
firmed the fact that Brooklyn fea-
tures of the new bill have been trans-
mitted by him to Albany. He de-
clared the Kings County situation
was "substantially the same" as pro-
posed last year when the reapportion-
ment bill was vetoed by the Gov-
ernor. Any changes made, accord-
ing to the Kings County leader, are
minor ones.

Under the present plan Manhattan
is due to lose four seats in the As-
sembly and one in the Senate in
the new bill. In Kings County Queens
would make a net gain of one seat in
the Senate and two in the Assembly.

The Republican leaders in Brook-
lyn, from Livingston down, believe
there is every likelihood the bill will
be passed in both houses of the
Legislature, and they admit they
are doubtful as to the fate in store
for the bill when it is again placed
before Gov. Smith.

The Governor last year vetoed a
bill passed by the Republican ma-
jority in the Assembly claiming that
the measure concerned some objectionable
features in the map of preserv-
ing districts in Manhattan.

Last year's bill was based on the
census taken in 1925 which showed
no gains in population for Kings and
Queens counties. Manhattan had
gained in population, which accounts
for the probable loss of four As-
sembly seats and one in the Senate
if Governor Smith should approve the
bill now being drawn. The measure,
according to Republican Senate
Leader John Knight, will be intro-
duced before the end of next week.
